### **Victorian State Gateball Championships 2023**

The weather was perfect – 20 degrees, mostly cloudy, minimal wind and no rain.

The club house is situated in the middle of a large playing area with a balcony overlooking a large court on the west with an adjacent large playing area to the east. Three Gateball Courts were marked out for the event.

Players from Queensland, New South Wales and South Australia travelled to join in and most teams consisted of players from more than one club

The teams event was held on Saturday with five teams competing in a 'round-robin' program.

Due to a convenient programming the very last match of the day saw the second placed team – Brunswick/Essendon playing the fourth placed team – Kew White. A win would have given Brunswick the championship - but was not to be.

The Kew Blue team was able to hold top spot.

Winners - Clare and Elaine defeated Alec and Maxine in an exciting Grand Final – photographed at the presentation with Philip the Tournament manager. The trophy was not photographed.

Just before you next enter our Clubhouse look up and you will see 'Brighton Croquet Club' emblazoned on attractive signage, which informs that the Club was established in 1915. That is 108 years ago - hang on there, not even Norman Ord is that old! A seriously old Club and flourishing!

Inside the premises a notice on the door to the playing greens, informs one that these premises are called 'Armstrong House' - sounds like this honours someone 'back in the day'. Hans Hiller has imaginatively posted on the eastern wall, notification that the Armstrongs - Tom and Jean - were inducted into the World Croquet Federation Hall of Fame.

Now step outside and immediately to the left, are floor tiles inscribed not only with the Armstrong names but also those of Creina Dawson and Neil Spooner. Now seriously, this is just a suburban Club in little old Adelaide - and at the time that the fourth of our members was honoured internationally, there were just 40 world-wide inductees. What on earth is in the water in this tiny neck of the woods?

Perhaps it is time for all members to go to the inconspicuous bookshelf at floor level on the eastern wall and read one of two histories written about this intriguing institution of which YOU are members. Get cracking! One booklet is titled 'Head Down and Follow Through' (as you all do of course, of course!) The other booklet, just as informative, is titled 'The First Hundred Years'.
