Letter from the Vice President Facilities February 2021

I received an email from Chloe Drogemuller (Holdfast Council) on Feb 2nd requesting that we attend a meeting on 10-2-21 to discuss with all other clubs a planned opening of the upgraded sporting complex tentative date Sunday April 11th.

Jackie and I attended the meeting with representatives from the other clubs. Council's plan is to have a large display of their trucks, excavators, fire brigades and heavy machinery etc for families to explore and climb on. They have successfully used this type of display at Wigley Reserve and would hope to attract perhaps 5,000 visitors over the day which will probably commence at 9.30am and run through to about 3.00pm. They would like clubs to advise what they are prepared to undertake to show case their facilities and what they have to offer. Food will be the responsibility of the clubs and it is expected that most clubs would run BBQ's and food vans would be used to complete the food options. The bar will be open at the football club at least and they are looking to promote their venue as a function venue option. Each club can choose what they would like to offer by way of Come and Try options or demonstrations of play or inspection of their facilities. Chloe requested all clubs to forward their proposals together with copies of their current Covid Plan and insurance policies by Wednesday Feb 17th and Council will prepare a Covid Plan for the overall event. (Jackie could you please email me a copy of our insurance policy to include in my response to Council).

Based on my discussion with Barry my suggestion is that we would want to run our BBQ with sausages onions bread and sauce similar to the Bunnings BBQ that we have done in the past with a Come and Try option for the whole day ie 10.00am to 3.00pm. Clearly we would need a lot of support from the members to assist on the day with running of the BBQ and handling anyone wanting to try playing croquet. Clearly it does provide an opportunity for great exposure to the general public. We may want to have club information sheets available to give to any interested participants.

Because of the Covid restrictions I suggest that the club room be only open for the use of our toilets and not be open for inspection.

The carpark has now been practically completed and we now have parking via Highett Ave to the south side of the Clubhouse and from Stopford Road to the northern end of the oval. I have had further discussions with the Council regarding the new bollard in front of our "driveway" which is removable but finished as polished stainless steel which is not as obvious to drivers as the brightly painted bollards used elsewhere near the grandstand. This will be rectified. The Council has provided new seats to our garden area as requested. We have requested that maintenance work and painting of our building be given priority.

ABERDEEN CROQUET CLUB - a Club that was!

Aberdeen was one of a group of small townships situated within the town of Burra. From the Burra Record newspaper of 20 February 1929 came a comprehensive report about the Aberdeen Croquet Club which formed on April 12th, 1928. At its formal opening the deeds of the land, bearing the croquet courts were presented to the Burra Council on the proviso that no playing of sport was to occur there-on a Sunday. Club colours were blue and white and the Foundation prime office-bearers included President Mrs J G Sara, Secretary Mrs Goble, Treasurer Miss L Bartholomaeus and Captain Mrs E McDonald. Mr James Isaac made and gave three mallets to the Club.

In April Mrs Sara was made a Life Member for her services in the formation of the Club. It was not the first croquet club in the town, having been preceded by the Burra Croquet Club.

By 1931 the Club was no longer in debt and Mrs E Steer was now Secretary and Mrs R Voumard Captain. In 1935 the President was Mrs W Gare, Open Champion was Mrs Steer and Single Championship winner was Mr Isaac. In 1939 the President was Mrs A Riggs whilst Mrs W Gare was made a Life Member and a new hall was erected. In 1940 the President was Mrs F Sara, Secretary Mrs Gare with Treasurer still Miss Bartholomaeus whilst the Captain was Mrs M Fuller. Two courts were now planned to be made full-size due to extra land donated by Mrs Gare. In 1954 the Club celebrated its 25th anniversary. Locally, it is thought that the club may have ceased operation in the late 1970s.

Millswood Nears its Centenary

Millswood Croquet Club is set to become one of the very few South Australian croquet clubs to survive and thrive over 100 years. The clubrooms were built in 1922 and it is believed that this was the year that Millswood C.C. was founded.

Many Brighton players have competed at Millswood, particularly in the balmy summer evening competition held annually. Indeed, our World Hall Of Fame star Creina Dawson performed her first triple peel there whilst playing the Association format.

The present clubrooms are very inadequate in size for a club of some 70 members and so a brand new building is to be erected, centrally situated on the Club's land with an outlook over all three courts and will be equipped with a larger kitchen and bar area and be disability accessible. The significant Norfolk Island Pine on site will be preserved and car parking will take the space occupied by the present clubhouse. Well-respected long-standing member Jane Lewis is Secretary.
