# Brighton Croquet Club History Matters: Episode 5

For pure dynamism it would be hard to surpass the energies of the late Sescadorowna Somerville known to all as 'Sesca'. After being one of Brighton's foundation members in 1915 she was living in Malvern in 1916 and was involved in the founding of the Sturt Croquet Club situated at the Unley Oval site. After that Club was unceremoniously booted out of that location in favour of football spectators, she helped found croquet clubs at both Malvern and Unley Park! Meanwhile Sesca had been involved in the very foundation of SACA, the croquet State body and there won high praise in her role as Manager. Around this time, she squeezed in a stint at Glenelg then, when her family moved to Brighton, became Captain of our club in 1925 but soon decided to found her own club, Araluen adjoining the Esplanade just a mere kilometre from Brighton Club's then location behind the Town Hall on Jetty Road. When Araluen disbanded in 1928 the peripatetic Sesca joined the South Park club briefly before again returning to our Club.

A tribute to Sesca appeared in the 'News' in May 1927 in the series 'Players Of Croquet' and was subtitled 'Writer and Student'. 'Mrs A Somerville secretary of Araluen Croquet Club in Brighton has been a foundation member of Sturt, Malvern, Unley Park and Araluen Clubs. Mrs Somerville takes a keen interest in poetry and historical research. Before marriage Mrs Somerville wrote under her maiden name Sesca Lewin and won several prizes in the SA Literary Societies' competitions. Two books of poems were published. Mrs Somerville confesses that nowadays with croquet claiming her attention and a family of six, she finds little time for writing. Four of her six children have gained University degrees.' (The children were born over only a six years period and included twins to help keep her occupied!)

The 'Register News-Pictorial' included more recognition of Sesca's prolific input to the sport in 1930. 'Mrs Somerville of Brighton was described by the President of SACA as one of the most valuable officials on the executive. For the last six years Mrs Somerville has been manager of Association fixtures, including tournaments, medal contests and pennants and with her at the helm, arrangements are always carried out satisfactorily. Mrs Somerville was on the committee which revised the constitution of the Association. Not only do metropolitan croquet players appreciate Mrs Somerville but she is held in high esteem by country players who come to the city to take part in Association fixtures. Players always refer to the kindness of Mrs Somerville in making provision for their comfort. Victor Harbour Club presented her with a gold-mounted fountain pen.'

In 1935 Sesca was reported in 'The Advertiser' to have been given a party at the home of Brighton's Lady Mayoress in King Street. 'A poem composed by Dr W Torr, framed with a miniature scene in water colours of the Brighton coast and jetty, was presented to Mrs Somerville as well as numerous posies.' Present were representatives of SACA, Brighton, Semaphore, Prospect, Glenelg and St Peters Clubs as well as Brighton President Kassie Silver.

Sesca Somerville died aged 85 after experiencing a stroke. Our Club could make a request to the SA Croquet Association to have this wonderful contributor to the development of our sport in this State posthumously recognised with a Life Membership!
